INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Grace Community of Tyler (a religious organization), which comprise the statement of financial position as of June 30, 2014, and the related statements of activities and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of their financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.

An audit includes performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. NOTE 1 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Activities

Grace Community of Tyler (Grace Community) is a religious organization that operates a church, a private school, and an early education center and is supported by donor contributions and by school tuitions and early education center fees. Grace Community's accounting records and reporting is on a fiscal year ending June 30.

Basis of Presentation

The financial statements of Grace Community have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and, accordingly, reflect any significant receivables, payables, and other liabilities.

The Accounting Standard Codification (ASC) is the Financial Accounting Standards Board's officially recognized source of authoritative U.S. generally accepted accounting principles applicable to all non-governmental entities. Grace Community has adopted the citation of ASC topics in its footnotes.

Promises to Give

Unconditional promises to give are recognized as revenues or gains in the period received and as assets, decreases of liabilities, or expenses depending on the form of the benefits received. Conditional promises to give are recognized only when the conditions on which they depend are substantially met and the promises become unconditional.

Grace Community does not solicit unconditional promises to give and currently has none outstanding. Accordingly, contributions are not recognized until received.

Solely for the purposes of planning and budget preparation, Grace Community solicits non-enforceable commitments from its donors; however, no effort other than discreet follow-up inquiry is made to collect non-receipt of amounts so committed.

Income Taxes

Grace Community is exempt from income taxes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and classified by the Internal Revenue Service as a church and church-related school and therefore is not required to file with the Internal Revenue Service.

Contributed Services

During the year ended June 30, 2014, the value of contributed services meeting the requirements for recognition in the financial statements was not material and has not been recorded.

NOTE 1 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Contributions

In accordance with ASC 958-605 "Not-for-Profit Entities, Revenue Recognition", contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.

The Elder Stewardship Board of Grace Community from time to time authorizes funds for which expenditures are restricted to specific purposes and for which it solicits contributions from donors. Contributions directed by donors to those funds are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the nature of the restrictions of the funds. When restrictions expire (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished), restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Grace Community does not accept donor-restricted contributions other than those directed to one or more of the restricted funds created by the Elder Stewardship Board.

All non-restricted contributions are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets.

Property and Equipment

All significant acquisitions of property and equipment and all expenditures for repairs, maintenance, renewals, and betterments that materially prolong the useful lives of assets are capitalized. Property and equipment are carried at cost or, if donated, at the approximate fair value at the date of donation. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful life of the asset.

Maintenance and repairs that do not materially extend the useful life of the assets are expensed as incurred. Upon the sale or retirement of assets, the cost and related accumulated depreciation are removed from the accounts and the resulting gain or loss is reflected in the earnings for the period. Buildings are depreciated over an estimated useful life of 20 years; leasehold improvements are depreciated over an estimated useful life of 10 to 15 years. Vehicles, office furniture, and equipment are depreciated over an estimated useful life of 5 years.

Advertising

Grace Community follows the policy of charging the cost of advertising to expense as incurred.

NOTE 1 – SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Donated Assets

Donated marketable securities and other noncash donations are recorded as contributions at their estimated fair values at the date of donation. The policy of Grace Community is to liquidate noncash donations as soon as practicable after receipt.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through January 21, 2014, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no subsequent events requiring recognition or disclosure.

Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable consists of school tuition and early education center fees.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statements of cash flows, Grace Community considers only unrestricted demand deposits and money market accounts, excluding cash equivalent funds held in Grace Community's investment portfolio, to be cash equivalents.

Concentration of Credit Risk

Grace Community places its cash, cash equivalents, short-term fund and marketable securities with high credit quality financial institutions which, at times, may exceed federally insured limits. Grace Community has not experienced any losses on such accounts.

Summarized Financial Information

The financial statements include certain summarized information from the prior year in total, but not by net asset class. Such information does not include sufficient detail to constitute a presentation in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. Accordingly, such information should be read in conjunction with the organization's financial statements for the year ended June 30 of the prior year, from which the summarized information was derived.

NOTE 4 – INVESTMENTS

ASC 820, "Fair Value Measurements," establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable information for similar items in active or inactive markets and have a lower priority, and Level 3 inputs, consisting of items for which there is significant unobservable information, have the lowest priority.
